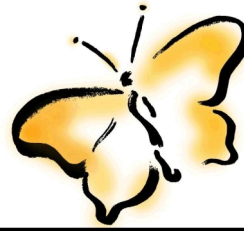

Prepare planting site by liberally adding humus or manure and working it into the soil. Set roots in 6" deep holes, 18-24" apart, with crowns just below the surface. Firm soil and water new planting. Adding high phosphate fertilizer (CAMPBELL'S ROOT STIMULATOR) when watering will aid in getting that plant established. Rhubarb will produce better if it is mulched with manure in the fall. In spring, dig the manure into the bed lightly. An application of high nitrogen fertilizer will hasten spring growth and produce tender, juicy stalks. Pull only a few stalks the first season to give plants a chance to get well established.
